# WASHINGTON AS WE SAW IT

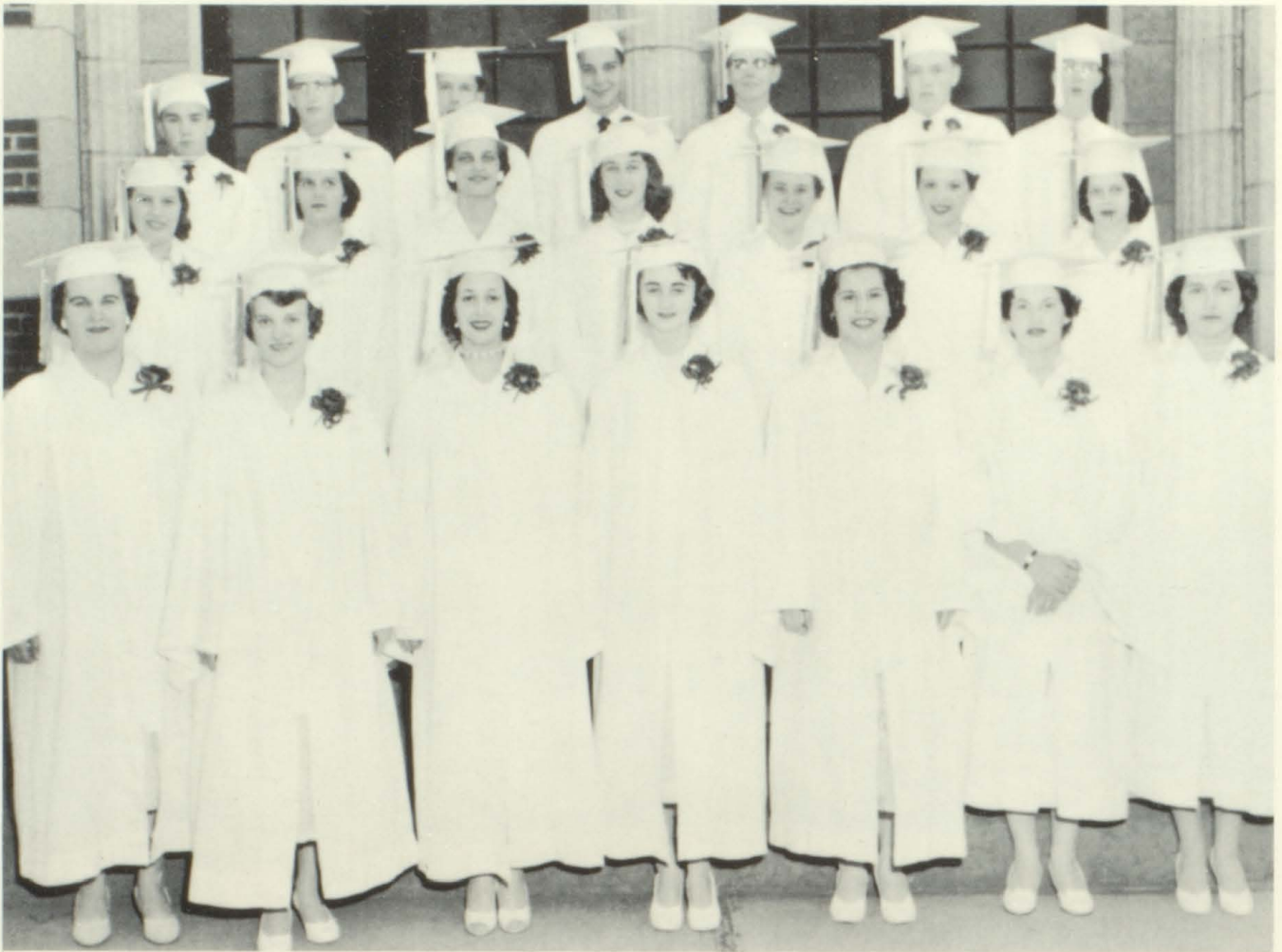


On our three-day trip to Washington D. C., St. Petersburg, Harrisville, and Emlenton enjoyed many interesting sights.
