These were the characteristics of Mrs. Park, who as a teacher and as a friend, imprinted on the minds of her students, the advantages and the necessity of a good education.

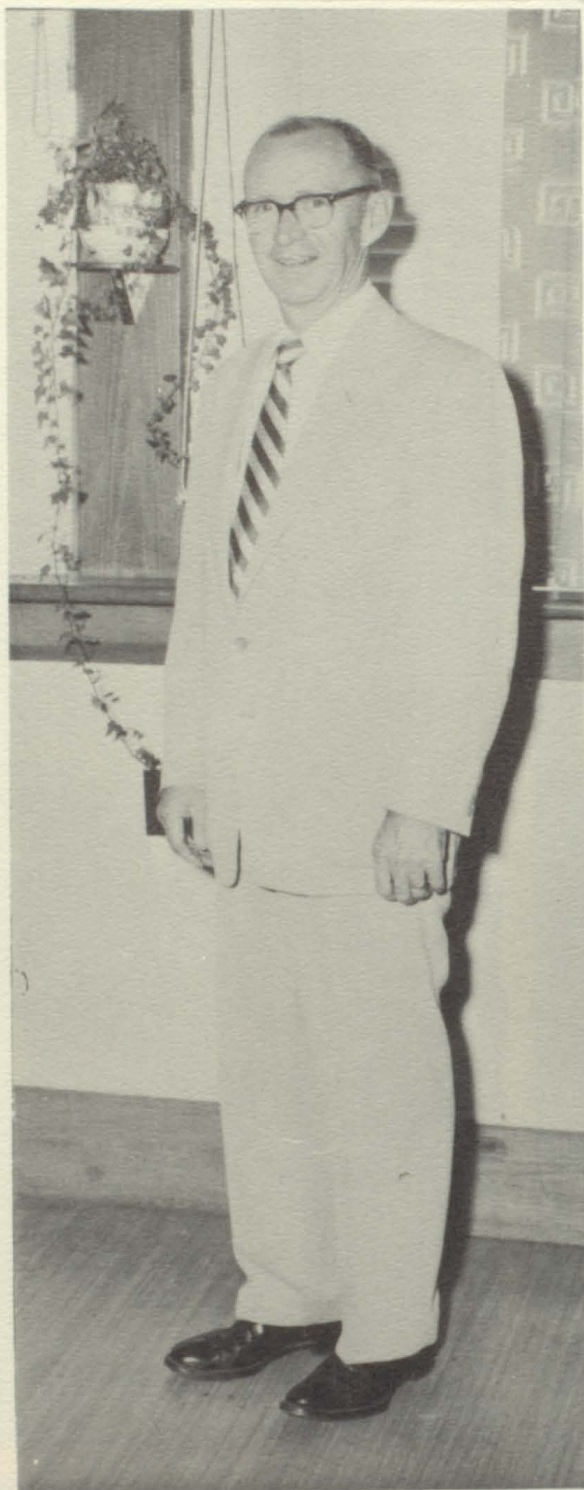
It is with sincere respect and gratitude that we, the Torch Staff, present the 1957 edition in memory of Nora Mahoney Park.

Art Education

Business Education

The Business Education courses are introduced in tenth grade and are continued on through twelfth grade.

Courses in general business, typing, shorthand, and bookkeeping prepare the students for positions in the business world.

These courses teach the method of solving business problems, typing business papers and letters, and the keeping of personal and business financial records.



Driver Training

Driver Training is a course offered to students of eligible age to teach them to be safe, courteous, and skilled users of our nation's streets and highways.

The students receive classroom instruction about the mechanism of the car and its operation. In addition they learn their legal and moral obligation as a driver. "Behind the Wheel" instruction in the automobile provided by the school is the practical application.

The value of this instruction is two-fold: to prepare the student for his driver's examination and to instill correct driving habits in the licensed driver.



Home Economics

A variety of projects, each concerning some phase of homemaking, is offered the girls in our school in their course in Home Economics, a required subject for Junior High and an elective in Senior High.

Textbook study and laboratory classes in foods and nutrition, clothing construction and care, consumer education, leisure time activities such as textile painting and flower arrangement, family relationships, etiquette, child care, safety, first aid, personality improvement, grooming, and the care of the home are all part of the course. These activities are included in the curriculum to prepare girls for their role as homemakers of the future.



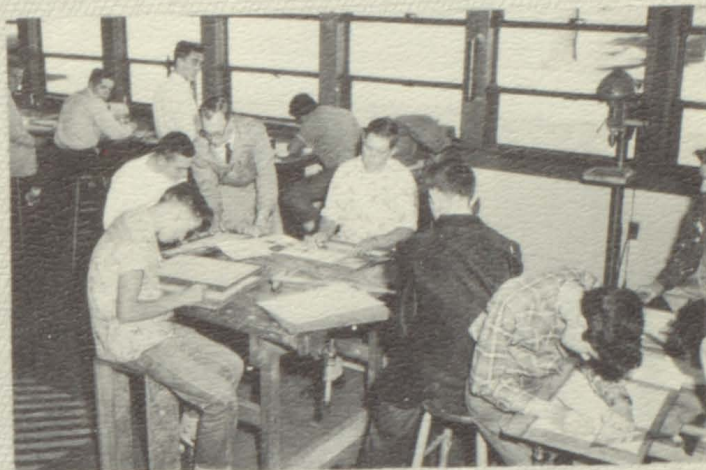
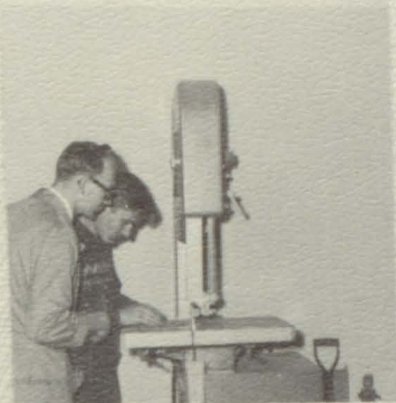


Industrial Arts

Industrial Arts is a required course for Junior High and an elective course for Senior High.

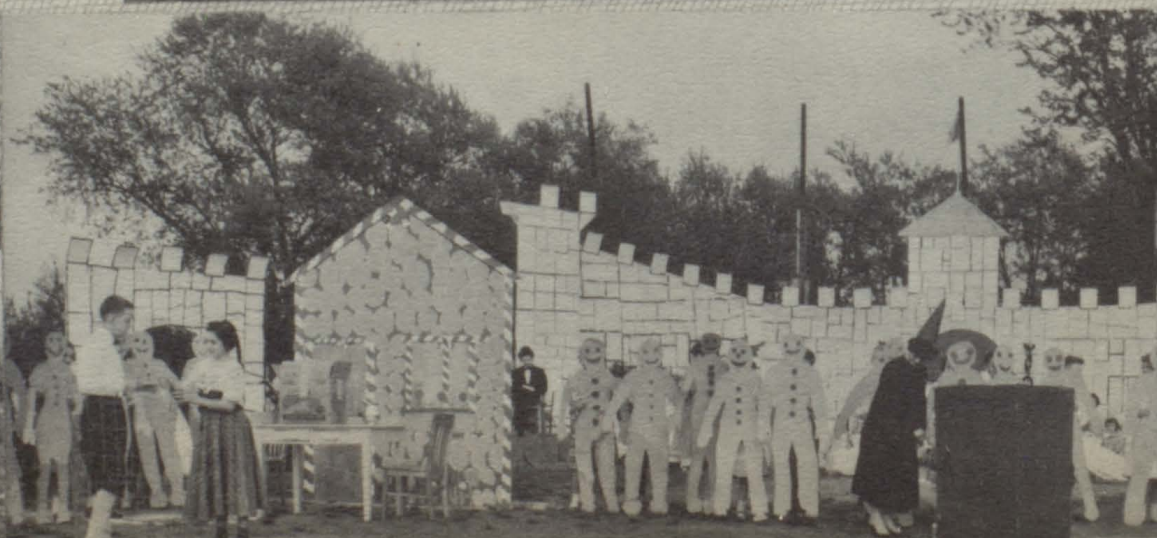
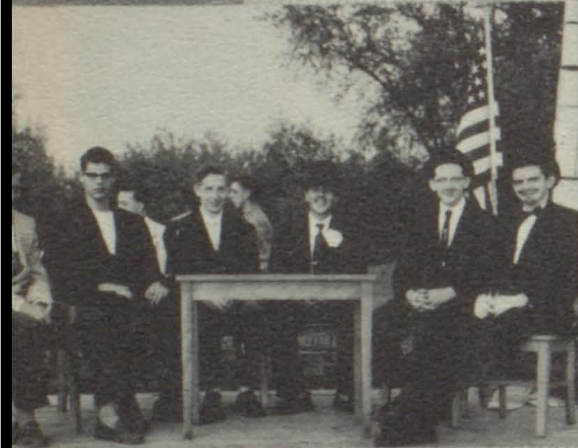
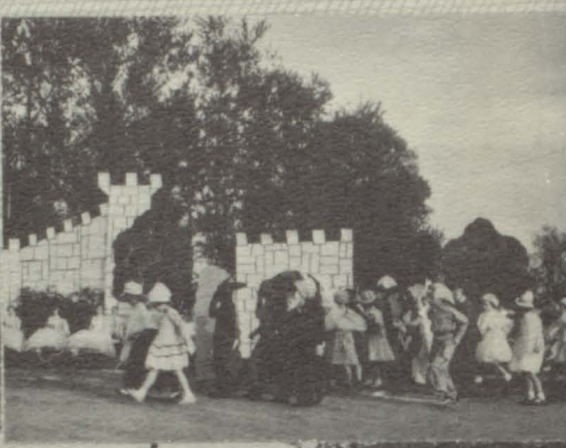
The Junior High boys learn to manipulate hand tools and to apply this knowledge in fundamental woodworking and metal projects.

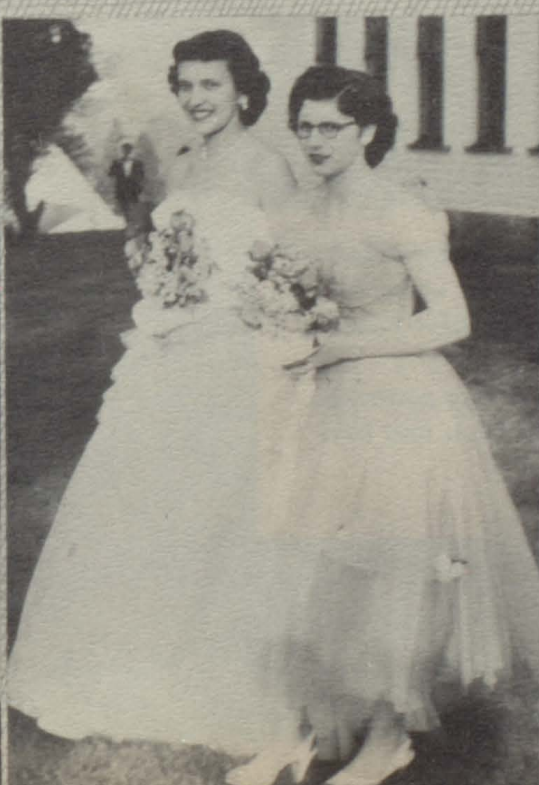



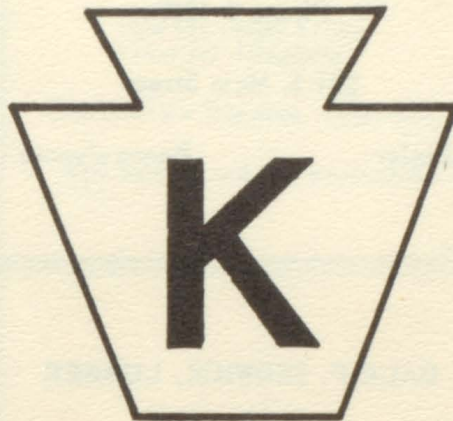
