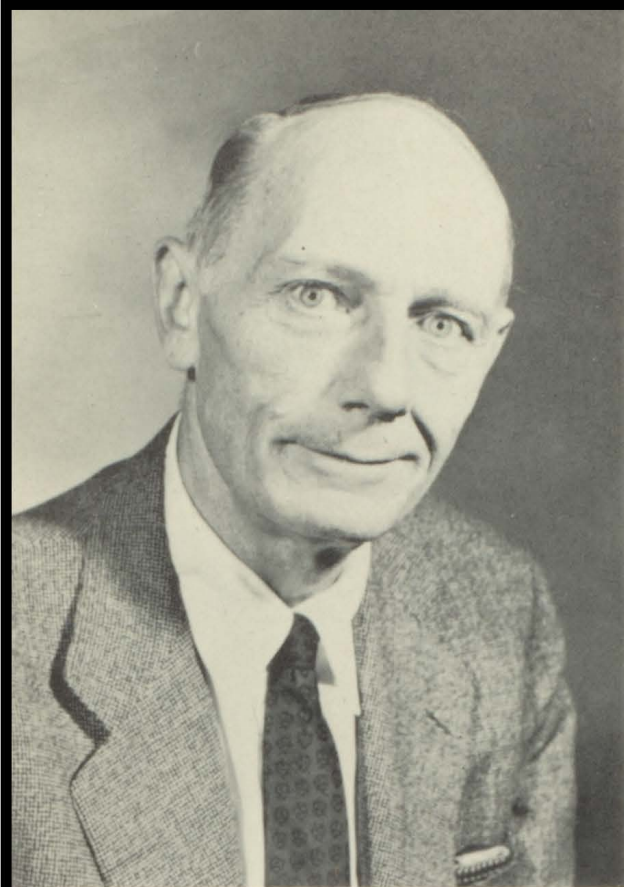
SUPERVISING PRINCIPAL

DEPARTMENTS OF OUR SCHOOL

ART EDUCATION

The aims of Art instruction are to teach the student to appreciate the beauty of his surroundings and to apply the knowledge learned to everyday living.

The junior high students are instructed in the basic fundamentals of art while the senior high students deal chiefly with the practical and ornamental phases of art.

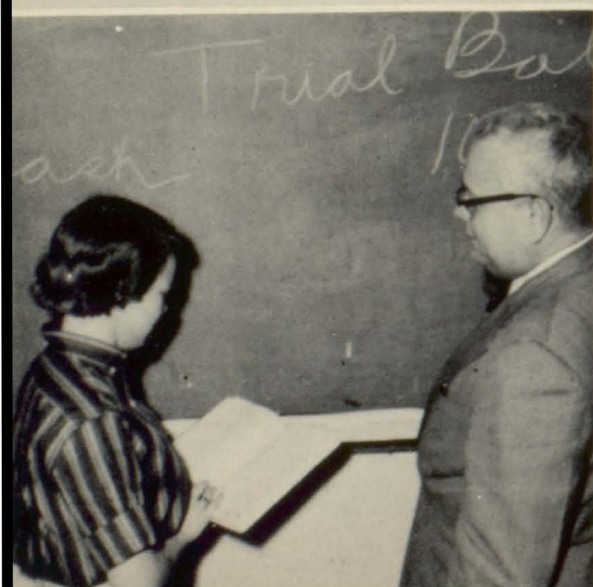
Some of the projects are charcoal drawing, finger painting, woodcarving, making mobiles, copper designing, and mural painting.



BUSINESS EDUCATION

The Business Education courses are practical courses offered in the tenth, eleventh, and twelfth grades to prepare the students for positions in the business world.

The business courses - general business, business arithmetic, typing, shorthand, and bookkeeping - teach the students the correct methods of solving business problems, typing business letters and papers, and keeping personal and business financial records.





DRIVER TRAINING

The Driver Training program is offered to students of legal driving age to teach them to be safe, courteous, and skilled drivers.

The students receive classroom instruction concerning the mechanism and operation of the automobile, and their obligations as a driver. The main objective is that knowledge comes first, then habit, and finally skill and the application of these fundamentals.

Each student receives personal training in the driver training car. The purpose of this instruction is to prepare the student for his driver's examination and to instill the correct driving habits in the licensed driver to make our highways safer.



HOME ECONOMICS

The Home Economics Department offers a variety of projects, each one concerning a phase of homemaking, to all junior high school girls.

The activities included in this course are textbook study and laboratory techniques in foods and nutrition, clothing care and construction, consumer education, family relationships, leisure time activities, proper etiquette, first aid and safety measures, personality improvement, correct grooming, and care of the home. These activities prepare the girls for their roles as the future homemakers of tomorrow.





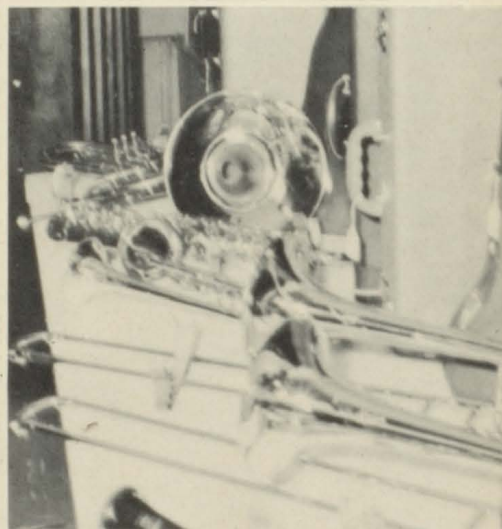
INDUSTRIAL ARTS

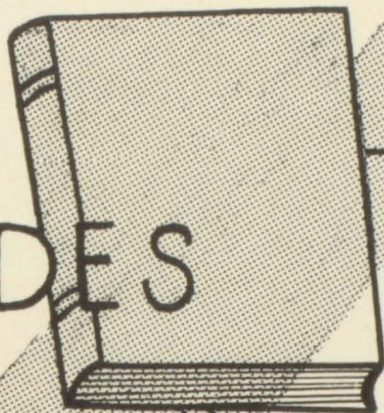
