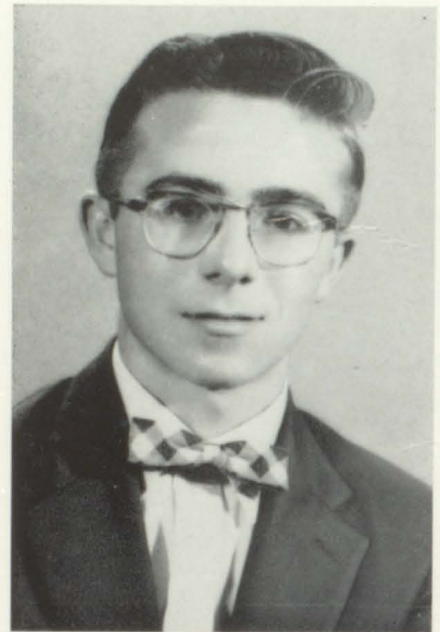


JOYCE MARIE McBRIDE "Joyce"

John, who is only a junior, saw plenty of action as a Varsity regular. John is a great rebounder and a fine player. He will be an asset to next year's team.



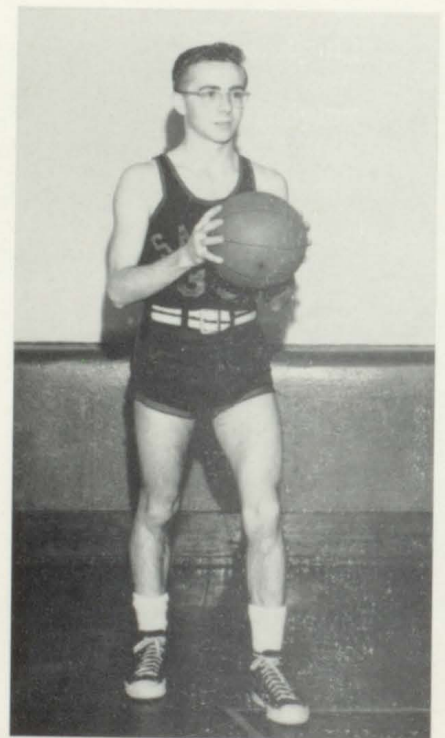
